## Graduation Requirements for a B.S. in Mathematics: Fall 2012 Catalog

I. General requirements of The College of Liberal Arts:

& Humanities

1. English 6 hours: Writ 100 or Writ 101 plus Writ 102 or Liba 102

6 hours: Engl 221 – Engl 226, Literature Survey

2. Language 6-12 hours: at least 6 hours at the 200 level or above

3. Social Science 12 hours: 6 hours must be chosen in one subject, with remaining 6

hours in a different subject or subjects; anthropology or sociology, African-American studies, classical civilization, economics, history, philosophy or religion,

political science, and psychology.

4. Fine Arts 3 hours: Art History, 101, 102, 201, 202; Music 101, 102, 103,

104, 105; Dance 200; Theatre 201

5. Related subjects 18 hours: Must include two laboratory science courses and a

computer programming course (e.g., CSCI 111, CSCI 251, or CSCI 259). Subjects related to mathematics are: astronomy, biology, chemistry, computer science, economics, geology, and physics. *Transfer students* 

must take at least 6 of these hours in residence.

6. Electives, to bring total degree hours to 124. **Note that 42 hours of the course work for graduation must be 300 level or above.** 

II. Mathematics courses (grades lower than C in mathematics courses will not be counted toward the mathematics major for the BS degree).

MATH 305 – Foundations of Mathematics

MATH 319 – Linear Algebra

MATH 555, 556 – Advanced Calculus

Six courses chosen from the 300 level or above.
